## SCASB Trip to Talladega, Alabama

## Are you getting ready to celebrate braille with us?

Contestants are divided into five groups. Beginning braille users take the Apprentice tests. The next level is Freshman. These students take spelling, reading comprehension and proofreading tests. Older students who have been reading braille for several years take Sophomore, Junior Varsity and Varsity tests. They

also take reading comprehension and proofreading tests, but they also take a speed and accuracy (transcribing) and a charts and graphs test.

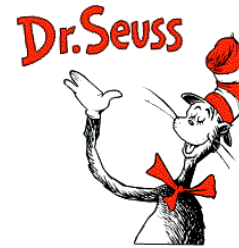

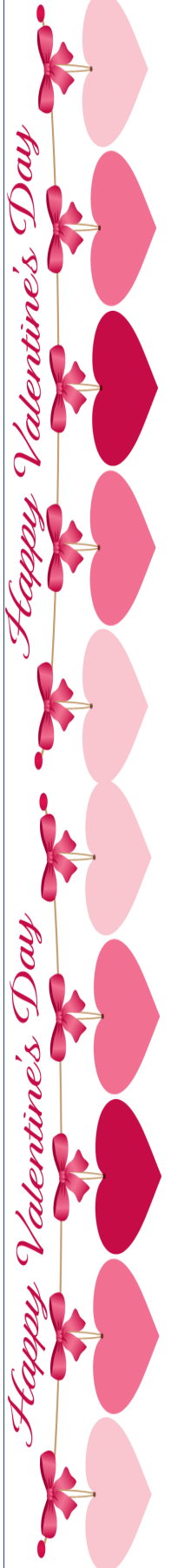
