
It's never too late to be caught being good....

We need to know how to listen. It is the **most important** communication skill of all.

Less than 10% is contained in the words we use. The rest comes from body language and the tone and feeling reflected in our voice.

Try to go **one whole hour** without talking even once.

Instead, just watch the people around you and listen to what they are saying.

**Good luck!**

Think of someone in your life who you think is a good listener. Your grandma? Your Dad? Your best friend? What do they do that makes them a good listener?

The next time one of your friends is sad, notice the way he or she hold their body.



Tell them you know they are sad and you want to help.

### **SEEK FIRST TO UNDERSTAND**

Because you so often listen autobiographically, you tend to respond in one of four ways:

**Evaluating:** You judge and then either agree or disagree.

**Probing:** You ask questions from your own frame of reference.


**Advising:** You give counsel, advice, and solutions to problems.

**Interpreting:** You analyze others' motives and behaviors based on your own experiences.

## Habit 5 - Seek First to Understand, then to be Understood

We need to know how to listen. It is the **most important** communication skill of all.



Less than 10% is contained in the words we use.

The rest comes from body language and the tone and feeling reflected in our voice.

What a great blessing it would be if we could teach our kids how to listen while they're young!

If you're like most people, you probably seek first to be understood; you want to get your point across. And in doing so, you may ignore the other person completely, pretend that you're listening, selectively hear only certain parts of the conversation or attentively focus on only the words being said, but miss the meaning entirely.

So why does this happen? Because most people listen with the intent to reply, not to understand. You listen to yourself as you prepare in your mind what you are going to say, the questions you are going to ask, etc.

You filter everything you hear through your life experiences, your frame of reference.

You check what you hear against your autobiography and see how it measures up.

And consequently, you decide prematurely what the other person means before he/she finishes communicating.

Does any of this sound familiar?

## Louis Braille

Louis Braille's birthday was January 4, 2019 and the Oklahoma School for the Blind has a display at the Muskogee Public Library.



If Louis Braille lived, he would be 210 years old now.

During his lifetime he was determined to come up with a system of dots whereby blind and visually impaired individuals would be able to write and read.

He did not stop until he invented "Braille", a system of six dots in a cell used with a combinations of characters, symbols, numbers, and letters to create letters, words, sentences, and paragraphs.

This method has allowed blind and visually impaired Individuals to become more independent in everyday life situations.

We want to thank Susan Jackman for putting up such a nice display at the Muskogee Public Library in recognition of Louis Braille and Braille Literacy.
